Directions: From the Capitol take Monroe St. South .1 miles to Gaines St. and proceed west approx. 1.2 miles to Lake Bradford Rd. Proceed through intersection bearing slightly right onto Stadium Dr. Proceed west on Stadium until you reach top of hill. Turn left onto W. Pensacola St. and proceed west for 7 miles (2 miles past Capital Circle) to St. Patrick Drive. Turn left onto St. Patrick Dr. Location is the third house on right.

WHY: To provide students with disabilities the opportunity to participate in a meaningful community-service project that will enhance their skills and self-esteem, while assisting a local resident in need.
