VOLUNTEER FLORIDA ANNOUNCES NEW COMMISSION OFFICERS

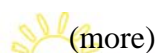
TALLAHASSEE – The Governor’s Commission on Volunteerism and Community Service, Volunteer Florida, is proud to announce the election of new Commission leadership.
