Alabama-West Florida Conference of the United Methodist Church	Michael	\$1,125,000	AWFC will repair or rebuild at least 73 Hurricane Michael damaged homes.
Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Miami, Inc.	Irma	\$925,000	Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Miami, Inc. will provide financial assistance to residents experiencing disaster-caused needs including rent/mortgage assistance to 60 families throughout Monroe County and infrastructure support to assist an additional 37 units of affordable housing in Monroe County.
Centro Campesino Farmworker Center, Inc.	Irma	\$750,000	Centro Campesino Farmworker Center, Inc. will provide comprehensive recovery services to Floridians affected by Hurricane Irma through home repairs, recovery financial assistance, and strengthening organizational capacity.
Florida Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Network, Inc.	Irma	\$25,000	FLAPDAN will assist Long Term Recovery Groups by connecting them with grants and other resources, especially through their partnership with Presbyterian Disaster Assistance.
Gulf District Schools	Michael	\$1,125,000	Gulf District Schools will complete repairs and upgrade existing HVAC to ensure the health and well-being of staff and students.
Metropolitan Ministries, Inc.	Irma	\$100,000	MM will prevent homeless families impacted by Hurricane Irma from becoming homeless through prevention assistance programs, including emergency, utility, rental, mortgage, and other financial assistance.
Rebuilding Together Broward County Inc.	Irma	\$225,000	Rebuilding Together Broward County, Inc. will serve Irma affected clients by providing utilities assistance, rent support, income replacement, food, clothing, transportation, medical supplies, and household items.
St. Lucie Habitat for Humanity	Irma	\$525,000	St. Lucie Habitat for Humanity will rebuild, repair and fortify Hurricane Irma damaged homes. This will be accomplished by repairing or replacing critically damaged roofs (approximately 34), installing impact windows or hurricane shutters, and repairing or replacing exterior Hurricane Irma damage (27 other repairs).
Star Of The Sea Foundation Inc.	Irma	\$225,000	Star of the Sea Foundation, Inc. will purchase and distribute food, primarily locally sourced fresh produce and proteins, to those still recovering from Hurricane Irma.
The Salvation Army	Irma	\$1,000,000	The Salvation Army will provide resources to those affected by Hurricane Irma who have exhausted all other sources of funding for personal unmet needs, such as rebuild/repair materials, household goods and furniture. The Salvation Army will be able to increase the number of unmet need cases served to 133.
The Salvation Army	Michael	\$600,000	The Salvation Army will provide resources to those affected by Hurricane Michael who have exhausted all other sources of funding for personal unmet needs, such as rebuild/repair materials, household goods and furniture. The Salvation Army will be able to increase the number of unmet need cases served to 240.

Town of Alford, Florida	Michael	\$150,000	The Town of Alford will assist in replacement of its volunteer fire station facility. The station was located next to the Town Hall building, which was also severely damaged. The equipment and trucks are being temporarily housed in an open pole barn until the facility can be rebuilt.

Irma	\$1,000,000	Florida Restores will support staff delivering holistic disaster services, including construction coordination and volunteer management and funding contractual costs and material and products.
**Citizens of Gulf County Recovery c/o United Way of Northwest Florida (acting as Fiscal Agent)	Michael	\$60,000	Citizens of Gulf County Recovery will hire a Construction Manager position for Gulf County recovery efforts. This dedicated professional role is extremely vital to help the community move forward with recovery.
**SBP/Hope Panhandle	Michael	\$500,000	SBP / Hope Panhandle will support rebuilding services to at least 24 homes to secure safe housing in Hurricane Michael-impacted communities.
