Volunteer Florida

Volunteer Florida was established in 1994 by the Florida Legislature to administer grants under the National and Community Service Trust Act of 1993.

Volunteer Florida is the Governor's lead agency for volunteerism and national service in Florida.

Volunteer Florida is governed by a Board of Commissioners appointed by the Governor and approved by the Florida Senate.





What does Volunteer Florida do?

Administers AmeriCorps and National Service programs

Coordinates volunteers and donations before, during and after disasters

Increases volunteerism through grants, trainings and recognitions

Manages the Volunteer Florida Foundation



AmeriCorps State and National

AmeriCorps State and National engages more than **65,000** men and women in intensive service each year at a variety of locations including **nonprofits**, **schools**, **public agencies**, **and community and faith-based groups** across the country.

AmeriCorps members help communities tackle pressing problems while mobilizing **millions** of volunteers for the organizations they serve.



Focus Areas for National Service



AmeriCorps Members commit to serve a full year and can serve:

Full-Time – 1700 Hours

Reduced Full-Time – 1200 Hours

Half-Time – 900 Hours

Reduced Half-Time – 675 Hours

Quarter-Time – 450 Hours

Minimum Time – 300 Hours



Examples of AmeriCorps Service

Provide **tutoring** and **mentoring** to students

Provide independent living and **financial literacy** to persons with **disabilities**

Provide career coaching and job skills training resulting in employment

Remove invasive exotics from public parks, restore habitat, visitor education

Home repair and housing units made available to disadvantaged individuals

Increase financial literacy or health access services for individuals

Disaster preparedness, mitigation and recovery

Things to Know

AmeriCorps programs are funded through federal grants.

Organizations apply to Volunteer Florida through a competitive process for a grant to support a minimum of the equivalent 10 full time members (i.e. 20 half time members).

The host or lead organization fully manages the program at the local level and includes 1 FTE or the equivalent in budget for program management.

AmeriCorps members are not staff and can not be placed in an administrative function.

Budget Instructions

Administrative/Indirect Costs – 5% Total

- Corporation Fixed (Section 1 + Section 2 x .0526 x .60)
- Commission Fixed (Section 1 + Section 2 x .0526 x .40)



Budget Example

Applicants can request the maximum of \$28,800 per 1 Member Service Year (MSY).

An applicant requesting 10 full-time members would apply for a \$288,000 grant.

1 full-time member = 1 MSY Cost per MSY = \$28,800 10 full-time Members = 10 MSY 10 MSY X \$28,800 = \$288,000

Match: 24% cash/in kind of the total grant

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Match Example:

10 full time members:

- Approximately \$288K federal request
- Minimum match estimate \$90K

Source of Match Type: Cash or In Kind

20 full time members:

- Approximately \$576K federal request
- Minimum match estimate \$180K

Examples: In Kind Donations, Local Foundation Grants, School District, State and Federal grants, Agency General Revenue

Budget Reminders

Calculations should be itemized and in equation format

Minimum living allowance for full time members should be higher than \$16,502 if requesting the higher cost per MSY

The cost per MSY can't exceed \$21,600 for Fixed; \$28,800 for Cost Reimbursement

Be sure to Include background check costs for all staff and members charged to the grant either Federal or Match

Include the Source of Funds information in Section III and the dollar amount in this section should total the dollar amount in the budget

Budget Travel costs for at least 2 staff members to attend 2 VF trainings (1 in Tallahassee, 1 (Orlando, Miami, Jacksonville, Tampa) – 3 if you are a new program

Commission Fixed is required and must be budgeted in the AmeriCorps section only

Be sure to include costs for member training, member gear, worker's compensation, and health insurance for members if FT

Application Instruction via eGrants system

A. Instructions for Submitting Applications (via AmeriCorps eGrants web based management system). Instructions are based on the grant cycle and type of grant requested.

- I. New Recompete or Continuation Applicants:
 - i. New Applicants: When submitting your application into the eGrants system, under the "Creating an Application" box (in the lower left hand corner of the page) click on "New".
 - ii. For Re-compete or Continuation Applicants (applicants that are currently funded by Volunteer Florida): When submitting your application into the eGrants system, under the "Creating an Application" box (in the lower left hand corner of the page) click on "Continuation/Renewal".



Application Instruction via eGrants system Cont'd

- II. Cost Reimbursement Applicants
 - i. Cost reimbursement applicants must select the following NOFA: FY 2022 AmeriCorps State and Territory Commission (New and Continuation) (Due date: 1/5/2022).
 - ii. Cost reimbursement applicants must select Florida from the state dropdown listing. Applicants should see that their application is linked to the Volunteer Florida Prime Application Grant ID Number: 22AC239843.
 - iii. All cost reimbursement applications must include a detailed budget per the FY 22 NOFO Application Instructions, Attachment C., page 24.



Supplemental Documents (New/Recompete)

- The most recent audit report including the management letter and the schedule of findings and questioned costs. If an annual audit is not required, please submit a letter to document.
- Operational and Financial Management Survey (OFMS). Please submit as a word document
- Completed provider assessment questionnaire.
- Certification of 60 day operating capital.
- Most recent agency-wide YTD consolidated financial statement and balance sheets.
- Evaluation and/or evidence documents per NOFO guidance.
- Diversity Questionnaire will be required for those who move on to the Clarification stage.

Evidence

- Review the Evidence Base (20 points) section on page 19 of the NOFO
- State your evidence tier (Pre Preliminary, Preliminary, Moderate, Strong)
- Support by submission of up to 2 reports (if applicable) to support evidence tier of Preliminary, Moderate, Strong
- Review the Mandatory Supplemental Information

Evaluation Requirements

 Submit Evaluation Plans to Volunteer Florida for review by 10/19/21 using provided template.



What Does it Mean to "Operate" an AmeriCorps Program?

The AmeriCorps program becomes yours!

Your organization must recruit and manage AmeriCorps members

Your organization must manage payment of AmeriCorps member living allowance

Your organization will develop local partnerships

Your organization will track and report progress

Your organization will submit monthly cost reimbursement invoices and support documentation.

Timeline

- September 20, 2021 Release Volunteer Florida AmeriCorps Competitive Application.
- October 12, 2021 (10:00 a.m., continuation applicants and 2:00 p.m. new/recompete applicants) - AmeriCorps funding application technical assistance webinars. To register go here for continuation and here for new/recompete.
- October 13, 2021 AmeriCorps funding application FAQs posted (anticipated).
- November 1, 2021, 5:00 p.m. EDT Applications due in eGrants and supporting documentation submitted.
- November 5, 2021 November 19, 2021 Peer, financial and staff review period.
- December 2, 2021 Clarification provided to applicants considered for funding.
- **December 13, 2021 by 5:00 p.m. EDT** Revised AmeriCorps applications due in eGrants.
- January 4, 2022 Estimated submission of approved funding recommendation to AmeriCorps.
- August 1, 2022 Anticipated contract start date.
