Florida Disaster Fund: Irma**

General Questions

Q: So, this is ONLY for repair/restoration of damaged properties, it CANNOT be for capacity building for disaster response?

A: Projects must be directly linked to Hurricane Irma damaged homes. Capacity building and mitigation projects are not eligible.

Q: Can funds be used to build capacity to respond to disasters (purchase tarps, create resource center, train staff)?

A: No, projects must be directly linked to Hurricane Irma damaged homes.

Q: Can funds be used to replace roofs for homes that are vulnerable to upcoming hurricanes but were not directly damaged by Irma?

A: Projects must have a direct link to Hurricane Irma. Funds can be used for repairs to homes directly linked to Hurricane Irma -- if roof damage can be linked to Hurricane Irma, it is an allowable project.

Q: Can you give an example of a long-term recovery project that responds to Irma damage?

A: on-site home rebuilds for families with unmet needs. LTRG recovery efforts and unmet needs groups, direct survivor assistance. Other projects with direct links to Hurricane Irma will be considered.

Q: Could funds be used for mobile homes?

A: Yes

Q: Is teaming allowed?

A: Yes, as long as it is identified and stated in your proposal.

Q: Is painting and facia work an allowable volunteer match?

A: Yes, as long as this is identified in your proposal/budget.
