AmeriCorps State and National



Focus Areas for National Service

Our members and volunteers support students in nearly 12,000 public, private and charter schools across the country. Through our work we improve attendance and engagement, increase high-school graduation rates and expand college enrollment.







We serve on projects that cover thousands of area of public lands across America – including many with the National Park Service. We help conserve natural habitats, protect clean air and water, and reduce utility bills by improving home energy efficiency.





Environmental Stewardship

When disaster strikes, we repair homes, assist survivors, and help restore communities when it matter most. We have deployed thousands of members and volunteers to areas affected by hurricanes, wildfires, floods, and tornadoes.





Disaster Services

We provide assistance to nearly 500,000 veterans and military families by connecting them to education opportunities, jobs, and the benefits they have earned. Many veterans also volunteer with us so they can continue to serve their country.

AmeriCorps Member Eligibility

Be a United States citizen, U.S. national, or a lawful permanent resident alien of the United States;

Be at least 17 years of age; and

Have a high school diploma or GED or work towards obtaining one while in the program. It is a requirement to obtain a high school diploma or GED before one is eligible to use the Education Award.

Must be clear of any record on the National Sex Offender Public Registry.

Must have a criminal record clear of any conviction(s) of murder.



AmeriCorps Members commit to serve a full year and can serve:

Full-Time: 1700 Hours

Reduced Full-Time: 1200 Hours

Half-Time: 900 Hours

Quarter-Time: 450 Hours

Minimum Time: 300 Hours





Examples of AmeriCorps Service

- Remove invasive exotics from public parks, restore habitat, visitor education
- Home repair and housing units made available to disadvantaged individuals
- Provide tutoring and mentoring to students
- Provide independent living and financial literacy to persons with disabilities
- Provide career coaching and job skills training resulting in employment
- Increase financial literacy or health access services for individuals
- Disaster preparedness, mitigation and recovery

Things to Know

AmeriCorps programs are funded through federal grants.

Organizations apply to Volunteer Florida through a competitive process for a grant to support a minimum of the equivalent 10 full time members. Volunteer Florida prefers applications with greater than 10 MSY. Volunteer Florida may consider funding for proposals who commit to increasing to 10 MSY within a three year period.

The host or lead organization fully manages the program at the local level and includes 1 FTE or the equivalent in budget for program management.

AmeriCorps members are not staff and can not be placed in an administrative function.

Budget Instructions

Administrative/Indirect Costs – 5% Total

- Corporation Fixed Calculation (Section 1 + Section 2 x .0526 x .60)
- Commission Fixed Calculation (Section 1 + Section 2 x .0526 x .40)
- If you have a Federally Approved Indirect Cost Rate, you <u>must</u> use it and you will see page 79, specifically B, to calculate.



Budget Example

Applicants can request the maximum of \$23,000 per 1 Member Service Year (MSY).

An applicant requesting 10 full-time members would apply for a \$230,000 grant.

1 full-time member = 1 MSY Cost per MSY = \$23,000 10 full-time Members = 10 MSY 10 MSY X \$23,000 = \$230,000

Match: 24% cash/in kind of the total grant.



Match Example:

10 full time members:

- Approximately \$230K federal request
- Minimum match estimate \$73K

Source of Match Type:

Cash or In Kind

20 full time members:

- Approximately \$460K federal request
- Minimum match estimate \$146K

Examples:

- In Kind Donations
- Local Foundation Grants
- School District
- State and Federal grants
- Agency General Revenue



Budget Reminders

ALL calculations should be itemized and in equation format.

Minimum living allowance for full time members is \$17,600.

The cost per MSY can't exceed \$23,000 for Fixed and Cost Reimbursement Grants.

Be sure to include background check costs for all staff and members charged to the grant either Federal or Match.

Include the Source of Funds information in Section III and the dollar amount in this section should total the dollar amount in the budget.

Budget Travel costs for at least 2 staff members to attend 2 VF trainings (1 in Tallahassee, 1 in Orlando, Miami, Jacksonville, or Tampa) – 3 if you have new program or finance staff.

Commission Fixed is required and must be budgeted in the AmeriCorps section only.

Be sure to include costs for member training, member gear, workers' compensation, and health insurance for members if FT.

There is a match requirement for the 2023-2024 contract year.

Public Health AmeriCorps

AmeriCorps is also offering the Public Health AmeriCorps Funding Opportunity where single state applicants must apply through State Service Commissions (Volunteer Florida).

- Public Health AmeriCorps applicants may request up to \$28,000 cost per MSY, there is no match required and applicant's program design must address Public Health Performance Measures.

Your organization must recruit and manage AmeriCorps members.

Your organization must manage payment of AmeriCorps member living allowance.

Your organization will develop local partnerships.

Your organization will track and report progress.

Your organization will submit monthly cost reimbursement invoices and support documentation.

- October 19, 2022 by 5:00 pm EDT Applications due in eGrants and supporting documentation submitted
- October 26 November 14, 2022 External and Internal Review
- November 21, 2022 Clarification provided to applicants considered for funding
- December 8, 2022 by 5:00 pm EST Revised AmeriCorps Applications due
- December 12, 2022 Volunteer Florida Commissioner review and approval
- **December 27, 2022** Submission of funding recommendation to AmeriCorps
- May 2023 Funding Notification from AmeriCorps
- August 1, 2023 Anticipated contract start date
